5 This includes \$10.0 million from the Prevention and Public Health Fund in FY2012 and a \$10 million Secretary's transfer in FY2013 Operating.

7 This reflects the transfer of \$5 million from Part A to Part B Base due to loss of eligibility of four Transitional Grant Areas.

8 On World AIDS Day 2011, President Obama directed an additional \$35 million in FY2012 funding to ADAP. The FY2013 CR did not continue those funds, and is therefore not reflected in the FY2013 Appropriated column. The Secretary of HHS transferred \$35 million again in May 2013, which is included in the FY2013 Operating column.

9 On World AIDS Day 2011, President Obama directed an additional \$10 million in FY 2012 funding to the Part C Program and \$5 million to Part C clinics located at Community Health Centers. The FY 2013 CR did not continue the \$10 million for Part C; however, the Administration continued the \$5 million for Part C clinics in Community Health Centers in FY 2013.

10 The President's FY2015 Budget Request proposes to consolidate Part D funds into Part C, as well as increase Part C by \$4 million.
